Yearly General Meeting

Free Curb and Gutter?

Free curbs and gutters along 24th Pl., 25th St., Pinchot, Avalon and Verde Dr. is back as a possibility, although the neighbors on Pinchot will probably opt out if this project wipes out most of their young trees. Using federal grant money to get this done free is the only option and this will require widening the streets, adding sidewalks, and making the street very wide which will take out most of the newly planted trees on Pinchot. Brett Bacon, PHA Vice-President, turned in a separate grant application about 6 months ago and it is looking good, although not a sure thing yet. We recently saw city of Phoenix engineers surveying the roads in the area and they said they were surveying for a future street gutter project in the area.



9th Annual Tree Planting Project

This year's tree planting project was much smaller since we could not get the great trees through the city of Phoenix tree planting program (it is on hold due to budget cuts). We still planted some smaller trees around the neighborhood provided by PHA. We have planted well over 400 trees in the neighborhood so far. Great job neighbors!

Ted's Place Bar a problem?

Many of your Neighbors are fighting to keep this neighborhood a safe place to live. Ted's Place, a bar located at 24th Street and Pinchot appears to be a threat to the safety of our neighborhood. The first night they opened as Ted's Place there was a shooting at the bar. Police officers tell us that when they arrived after being called by the victim (bar employees never called), they found the head bartender more intent on mopping up the blood as quickly as possible (destroying evidence) then willing to help police. Since that time there has been many more problems and many neighbors are fighting mad. So much so that they have written protest letters to the City Council and helped persuade them to vote against allowing Ted's Place to get a liquor license.

The final vote comes down to the liquor board (which does not always vote with the city council) on May 1st at 9:30 am. You can attend to voice your opinion at the 5th floor hearing room at the AZ Dept. of Liquor Licenses at 800 W. Washington. Parking is free just west of the building including the 2 story parking garage. You can also make your opinion known by raising your hand when the board polls people in the audience.
